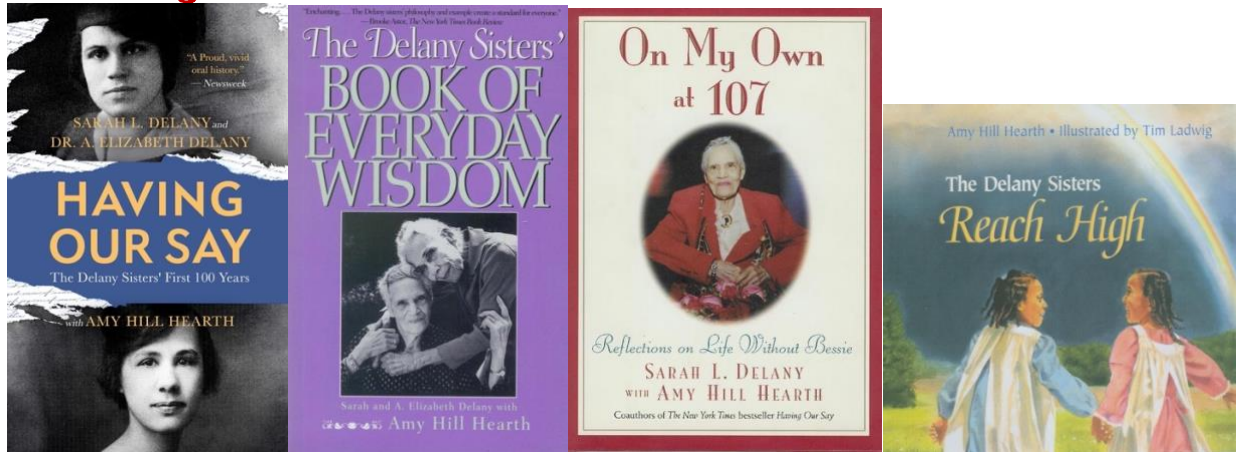


Join us virtually for Coffee & Conversation to meet-
